COLLEGE STARTED SHORT TERM COURSES WHERE THEY CAN LEARN SKILLS WHICH CAN BE USED FOR EARNING FROM HOME. COURSES LIKE BEAUTY PARLOUR, MAHENDI, TAILORING, SOFT TOY ETC. ARE PLANNED FOR THEIR EMPOLOYABILIY SKILL DEVELOPMENT SO THAT THEY CAN BE SELF RELIANT. THE PRACTICE: COLLEGE RUNS VARIOUS SHORT TERM COURSES UNDER UGC-CPE FOR WOMEN EMPOWERMENT. THESE COURSES ARE DESIGNED AS PER THE REQUIREMENT OF THE MARKET. COURSES ARE RUN DURING COLLEGE WORKING HOURS SO THAT THEY CAN EASILY ATTEND THEM. THEY ARE GIVEN THESE COURSES AT NEGLIGIBLE FEES OF JUST RS. 50. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS: GOOD NUMBER OF GIRLS STUDENTS JOINED THE COURSE AND THEY ARE ALSO EARNING WELL FROM BEAUTY PARLOUR AND MAHENDI. SOME OF THE STUDENTS HAVE ALSO STARTED THEIR BOUTEQUES. PROBLEM ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED: IT IS VERY HARD TO CONVINCE THEM THAT THESE EXTRA COURSES WILL BE USEFUL TO THEM. THEY HAVE RIGID MENTALITY AND THEY ONLY FOCUS ON BOOKS AND REGULAR DEGREE. AWARENESS ABOUT SUCH COURSES AND EMPLOYABILITY OPPORTUNITIES IS LACKING IN RURAL AREAS. THE BIGGEST PROBLEM IS RELATED WITH EXTRA HOURS IN CLASS AND MAJORITY OF THE STUDENTS COME FROM RURAL AREAS SO THEY HAVE TIME CONSTARINS REGARDING THEIR BUS TIMINGS.
